### Social Security Qualifications Reduced

Grady Grubbs Field Representative Under the revised social security law, the number of quarters of coverage needed to qualify for retirement and survivors benefits has been reduced.

For example: under the old law, a worker reaching re-tirement age this month (65 for men, 62 for women) would have needed 19 quarters to be eligible for benefits. Under the new law, this same worker would need only 12 quarters of coverage. This same rule applies to death cases.

It will be possible now in some cases to pay benefits to survivors of deceased workers and to retired persons whose claims were previously disallowed because they were not insured. However, this provision does not apply to disabled workers. The requirement that disabled workers must have worked at least 5 years out of the last 10 (20 quarters out of the last 40) just before they became disabled must still


