Hattle Palmer

State Law and Ordinances of the Town of Murphy prohibit the sale, possession, or use of fire crackers.

"It shall be unlawful for any individual, firm, parmership or corporation to manufacture, purchase, seil, deal in, transport, possess, receive, advertise, use or cause to be discharged any pyrotechnics of any description whatsoever within the State of N.C.

"Possession of Pyrotechnics (Fire Crackers) by any person shall be prima facte evidence that such pyrotechnics are kept for purchases in violation of this

Protests from many of the citizens of Murphy have resulted in the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Murphy instructing the Town Policemen to arrest any and all persons violating the above law.
