MISS WALL AND MR. MINTZ ARE MARRIED



Under the laws of North Carolina, each Soil Con-servation District is enti-led to request the semolul-

led to request the appoint-ment of two men to serve as supervisors in addition to the three regularly elected supervisors.

At a recent meeting of the three regularly elected sup-ervisors, the board voted to request the appointment of the two additional members. Those men selected were E. G. Battle, of Andrews, and Noah Hembree of Peachtree and Murphy. The request to the State Soil Conservation Committee resulted in the quick appointment of these

two men. The Board of Supervisors for the Cherokee County Soil Conservation District now consists of the following five Charlie McDonald of Owl Creek; Don Taylor of Suit: Clyde McNabb, of Mocassin Creek; E. G. Battle, of Andrews; Noah Hembree of Peachtree.

The Cherokee Soil Con-servation District and the technicians of the Soil Conservation Service have been called on to assist more than two hundred Cherokee County farmers in planning and estab-lishing Soil and Water Conservation practices during 1960. Fifty-five farmers developed complete Soil and Water Conservation Farm Plans during the year. These complete plans covered all of the con-


