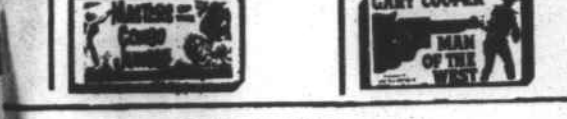

Washington - The statement by Senator Mike Mansfield which was carried in the press regarding the desirability of calling off the militant efforts by some liberal Senators to change the so-called filibuster rule of the Senate is very encouraging. Moreover, I think it reflects the studied thought of the Senator from Montana.

Could Be Avoided - Senator Mansfield, as reported in the news story, is anxious to get ahead with the program of the Kennedy Administration and wishes to avoid a bitter fight in the Senate, a debate which will certainly take place if further efforts are made to restrict speech in the Senate.

This can be avoided by going about the business of legislating for the needs of the country when the new Session convenes rather than dragging out the old rule-change proposal. The rule was changed in the last Congress, a compromise, and no further action is needed. The last bastion of unlimited speech in the world is in the Senate and its use to kill unwise legislation has been demonstrated many times. Facts show that the use of unlimited speech in the world is in debate by Southerners has been resorted to less frequently than by others, the so-called liberals being among the group which has traditionally protected a minority point of view by the right to discuss legislation thoroughly.

Move Forward - The issues of the day should be debated carefully. Freedom lost is very difficult to recover. He who applies the gag to ger-

mane debate in the Senate is doing democracy no service. I expect to continue my fight against changing the rules and to do all within my power to see that reasonable men, such as Senator Mansfield, can be heard over the tumult of those who for one reason or another always want to change the rule to limit debate.

Soil Conservation News

The State Soil Conservation Committee in Raleigh recently announced the appointment of two men to serve three-year terms on the Cherokee County Soil Conservation District Board of Supervisors. Under the laws of North Carolina, each Soil Conservation District is entitled to request the appointment of two men to serve as supervisors in addition to the three regularly elected supervisors.

At a recent meeting of the three regularly elected supervisors, the board voted to request the appointment of the two additional members. Those men selected were E. G. Battle, of Andrews, and Noah Hembree of Peachtree and Murphy. The request to the State Soil Conservation Committee resulted in the quick appointment of these two men.

The Board of Supervisors for the Cherokee County Soil Conservation District now consists of the following five men: Charlie McDonald of Owl Creek; Don Taylor of Sutt; Clyde McNabb, of Moccasin Creek; E. G. Battle, of Andrews; Noah Hembree of Peachtree.

The Cherokee Soil Conservation District and the technicians of the Soil Conservation Service have been called on to assist more than two hundred Cherokee County farmers in planning and establishing Soil and Water Conservation practices during 1960. Fifty-five farmers developed complete Soil and Water Conservation Farm Plans during the year. These complete plans covered all of the con-

servation measures needed and wanted on each farm. Individual practices completed include more than half a mile of open ditch or canal drainage. More than a mile and a half of tile ditches were surveyed and completed during the year. By these two drainage practices, approximately seventy-five acres were either brought into economical production or were made easier to farm, due to ridding the fields of excess water. Conservation farmers established more than twelve hundred acres of improved pasture. More than two hundred acres of steep, shallow, or idle land was returned to the production of forest products by tree planting or by natural reforestation.

1960 was a good year from the standpoint of Soil and Water Conservation practices established.
