Winter Adult Trade-Technical Classes To Start

Registration for winter adult trade and technical classes will get under way on Monday and Tuesday nights, January 16 and 17, at 7:00 p.m. in the Lee H. Edwards High School Vocational Building, Asheville. Residents of North Carolina sixteen years of age or older who are not enrolled in the public schools are eligible to attend. The courses are free except for a nominal fee charged for the cost of supplies and use of equipment. Information on these courses may be obtained from Thomas W. Simpson, Director of the Industrial Education Center, whose office is on the eighth floor of the City Building, telephone AL 4-4300. These classes will be transferred to the new Industrial Education Center on Victoria Road as soon as these facilities are available.

Courses to be offered are: **MACHINE SHOP** - a 1080 hour certificate course which is approved for veterans training. This class meets on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday nights, 6:30 to 10:15 p.m. It is open to any individual who desire to become a machine operator or machinist. Register January 16 at 7:30 p.m. Related machine theory and shop practice. Mr. William E. Black and Mr. Earl Elliott are instructors.
BASIC ELECTRONICS TECHNOLOGY - a three month beginning course in electronic covering basic electron theory, circuit components, vacuum tubes, amplifiers, and complex circuitry. Meets on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday nights from 6:30 p.m. to 10:15 p.m. Lecture and laboratory work. Approved for veterans training. Register January 16 at 7:00 p.m. Mr. Steve Creasman and Mr. Daniel Burns are instructors.

ASC News

 In those areas where soil fertility and organic matter make the use of alfalfa questionable, sericea lespedeza shows promise as the long-lived perennial legume. Some of the best stands were on slopes where erosion had taken 3 to 6 inches of top-soil.
 Sericea makes little or no growth the first year. After that, a hay crop and a seed crop or two hay crops may be removed each year. Hay yields are one to four tons a year if cut when 12 to 14 inches tall. Total protein in the hay runs about 13 per cent compared with about 15 percent for Alfalfa. Seed yields vary from 200 to 500 pounds an acre. As a hay crop, Sericea has the advantage of curing much more rapidly than other legumes crops harvested in the spring. Usually it can be cut one morning and raked in the afternoon and baled the following morning.

The fertilizer requirements are the same for Sericea as for common lespedezas or other forage crops. Lime, phosphate and potash should be applied according to soil test. Good stands result from inoculated, scarified seed broadcast at 35 pounds per acre on a good cultipacked seedbed. Spring planting provides a conservation reserve cover.
 The Cherokee County ACP vendors will get this seed for you in plenty of time. However, I don't know of any of them that have been carrying it in stock in previous years.
