THE VETERANS CORNER

Here are authoritative answers from the Veterans Administration to questions of interest from former servicemen and their families.

Q - I sold my GI home and got a release from liability from the VA for any future payments. Am I now eligible for another GI loan?

A - You may or may not be. Release from liability does not automatically restore eligibility for another loan. It is restored only under certain conditions, such as selling your home because of health reasons, moving to another area for a better job, etc.

Q - Under the old death compensation program, the widow of a deceased peacetime veteran received less than the widow of a wartime veteran. Is this true under the Survivors Benefits Act?

A - No. The Survivors Benefits Act provides equal payments for widows of both war and peacetime veterans.
