## Small Watershed Project Needed on Valley River, Says Agent

A group of about thirty farmers from the Peachtree and Slow Creek sections met at Peachtree School late in March for the purpose of discussing the formation of a Watershed Association in that area. The Watershed Association will be formed with the intention of eventually requesting assistance from the Federal Government in curbing the frequent and damaging floods which take place

on these two creeks. A law passed by the Congress in 1954, officially known as Public Law 566, but popularly known as the Small Watersheds Act, makes it possible for the residents of a particular watershed to seek assistance for construction work and other watershed improvements which will virtually eliminate flooding on such a watershed. Jim Lankford, who is Soil Conservationist in Towns

County, Georgia, attended the meeting at Peachtree and showed a number of color slides of construction work which has been recently completed in Hightower Creek Watershed. Jim gave a very interesting talk in conjunction with the slides, and every one present had a much better idea of the work which is necessary on such an undertaking. Jim pointed out that during

the heavy rains which fell on 25 February and again on 8 March, there was absolutely no flooding of the creek bottoms anywhere in Hightower Creek Watershed. One flood pool above a dam built on Hightower Creek was more than eighteen feet above its normal level, but no flooding occurred below the dam. In contrast to the lack of flooding in Hightower Creek,

all of the streams in Cherokee County were out of banks and did much damage to the bottom lands here. The first picture printed with this article shows Valley River badly flooding. The large Oak tree in the center of this picture is ordinarily on the edge of Valley River on the Andrews Road near the High School. At the time the picture was made, the

River had not reached its crest, but the tree is more than thirty five feet out in the River. The second picture shows a field on the Dickey farm near Marble covered with flood waters from the Valley River. A small watershed project on Valley River would practically eliminate the danger of such flooding occurring again in the future.
