Dainty Sandwiches for a Party

Having a party? Now is the time for informality and fun. A light-hearted atmosphere gives everyone a carefree feeling that's bound to make your party a success.

And it's easy to prepare for your party. After winter's heavy fare, your guests will welcome light refreshments. If you serve sandwiches--the small dainty kind--you can prepare them a day ahead and keep them ready to serve in your refrigerator.

You'll save time in making them if you prepare all your fillings in advance. Then you can spread all the slices of bread in one operation.

To store them place a slightly damp cloth on a tray and cover it with waxed paper. Then place the sandwiches on the tray, cover them with another piece of waxed paper, and top that with another damp cloth. Slide them into your refrigerator till time to serve.

You'll use day-old bread, sliced very thin. Spread one side of rounds, squares, triangles, and rectangles with butter or margarine to keep moist fillings from penetrating bread. For easy spreading, work butter or margarine with a spoon till it's soft and creamy.

If you have your own favorite recipes for fillings, by all means use them. But, if you don't, here are three that give variety. One is a fruit-nut filling; one, chicken; and one, shrimp.

For the fruit-nut filling, combine 2/3 cup chopped dates; 1/4 cup chopped walnuts; 5 tablespoons mayonnaise or salad dressing; 1/2 teaspoon lemon juice; and a few grains salt. Mix well and place in refrigerator till chilled before spreading.

**40 Miles of Roads Improved**
