Peter tells us "for even here-unto were ye called; because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example that ye should follow His steps." 4 knew one boy who thought that his cross was the pain he suffered from being afflicted with arthritis. I had a woman to tell me that she was positive that her cross was a brutal and drunken husband that she had to put up with. But these types of things are not our crosses Our cross is something very difficult. It is an everyday matter. It is the crucufying of our own will and putting in its place the will of God, It is to crucify that very strong thing


