He received experience in driving the Army's medium tank and became proficient in firing the .30 and .50 caliber machine guns and the 90 millimeter tank gun.

Amos is a 1958 graduate of Murphy High School and a former student at the University of North Carolina.

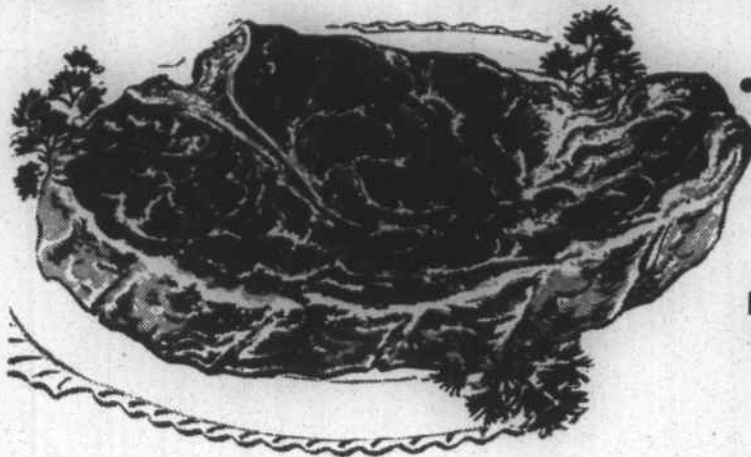
