PLATE SALE

Deep Branch Volunteer Fire Department will sponsor a plate sale on Friday, Feb. 26, from 10 a.m. until. The county winning poster will be sent to the state office in Greensboro for state competition on March 15, 1982. In addition to the awards mentioned above, bicycle safety flags will be given to the first, second, and third place winners in the Robeson County Contest.
