FINANCIAL AID AVAILABLE AT PSU FOR NEXT YEAR

Despite the negative reports that one hears about the future financial picture for higher education, PSU, where some 60 percent of the students this year receive some type of aid, has a positive report about next year.

"We will have sufficient funds available for those who apply early and qualify for financial aid," says Esther Jacobs, financial aid officer at PSU.

By early, she means applications should be in by April 15.

For campus-based financial aid programs, Mrs. Jacobs says there is "no income ceiling that says a student is ineligible." Factors that are weighed include size of family, total income, mortgage on the house, medical expenses, etc.

By the same token, Tommy Swett, director of special services at PSU, says funds will adequately provide for students in "Upward Bound," etc. for this year.

Dr. Charles Jenkins, academic dean who is in charge of PSU's Chancellor's Scholars Program, says scholarship funds for this program have been increased. "We will be able to provide full tuition scholarships for 30 Chancellor's Scholars for the 1982-83 academic year," Dr. Jenkins says. There are 23 Chancellor's Scholars this year.

Other PSU scholarships are available through funds from the PSU Foundation, Inc.

So, students, please get your financial aid applications in early!

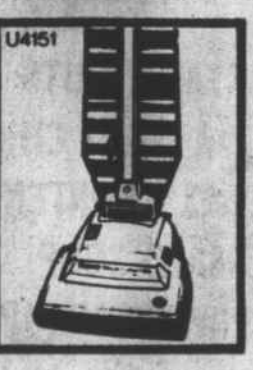

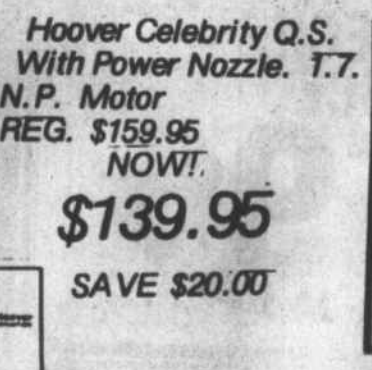
