**PEMBROKE STATE'S WOMEN'S TENNIS TEAM IS SECOND SEASON LED BY LUMBERTON'S KAY CARTER**

Women's tennis at Pembroke State University seems to be on the move as the Lady Braves blasted off to a 3-2 fall record and are now amidst the spring schedule.

Coach Ann Webb, head coach of the women's tennis program at PSU, feels the squad is improving.

"We are playing a strong schedule this spring," Coach Webb began. "The team is working hard and improving. We are doing lot of things right in practice and if we can continue to play with confidence, we should win the close ones."

Playing No. 1 for the Lady Braves is Lumberton's own Kay Carter, a sophomore. She finished the fall season in the No. 2 spot with four wins and one loss.

"Kay is a real competitor," said Coach Webb. "She has worked hard on her game and has improved her total game since last year. She is a tennis enthusiast and an inspiration to all the team."

No. 2 is manned by junior Julie Hall of Mt. Gilead. Coach Webb added: "Julie has a nice serve and baseline game and hits the ball with power. She plays first doubles with Kay Carter."

Junior Debbie Caviness of Goldsboro is at the No. 3 spot as she "is hitting the ball with more depth and playing better than she has ever played," Coach Webb stated.

Fourth spot in singles action is played by sophomore Sharon Smith of Fayetteville. "Sharon has very good fundamental strokes and she should become a winner in the fourth spot," Coach Webb predicted.

Others playing in order for the Lady Braves net team this spring is freshman Kathy Gooden of Clarkton, junior Yvonne James of Winston-Salem, sophomore Lynn Guyton of Fayetteville, freshman Karen Ryder of Fayetteville, junior Lisa Gonzalez of Fayetteville, and junior Britt Brayboy of Pembroke.

Pembroke State University's Lady Braves basketball team has put their uniforms away for another year, but the 1981-82 season will be remembered for a long time. The Lady Braves zoomed to a perfect 7-0 Carolinians Conference regular mark, posted a perfect 10-0 home record, and finished 16-9 overall and in addition advanced to AIAW Regional competition for the first time ever.

"We are very pleased with the regular season outcome and the effort," stated third-year Coach Linda Robinson. "We knew we had a young, talented team, but we are nothing but pleased with the success of this year's unit."

Coach Robinson added, "We feel very fortunate to have been 10-0 at home and we had posted several good wins on the road especially at Elon and High Point. We did not lose a close game during the regular season which speaks well for the young squad."

Three school records were broken during the 1981-82 women's cage season. Junior transfer Donna Moody broke two records for most free throws made in a single game and the most attempted. Against Baptist, the Fayetteville native made 14 free throws and attempted 16. The old record was nine free throws made and 14 attempted.

As a team, the Lady Braves posted the best free throw percentage in women's basketball history making 62.6 percent (305 of 487) through the 25-game season. The old record was set during the 1979-80 season when that team made 59.2 percent.

"Our young players kept getting better and better," Coach Robinson continued. "We were pleased to see freshmen Barbara Green and Dee Major improve so much during one season and look forward to next season."

And speaking of next season, the Lady Braves are in excellent shape as the entire team is back.

"We are elated and it is a coach's dream to have the entire team back," continues Coach Robinson who owns a 47-28 career record at PSU. "They are already working on their own for next season which shows they are determined to be a fine ballclub."

As far as recruiting, Coach Robinson says she has no commitments, but they are looking for the strongest recruits for the positions. Coach Robinson hopes to add one guard, one forward, one center, and an extra player.

"We played some very good teams during the season and that is one reason that our final record of 16-9 might not sound so good. But the strength of our schedule was extremely tough," Coach Robinson added.

Pembroke State's victim in the Regional Tournament went on to win the region and is seeded first going into the AIAW National Championships. Seeded second is Francis Marion. PSU played three games with those calibre teams.

The final stats found that the Lady Braves had five players average in double figures. Leading the attack was Donna Moody (18.8) while the others scoring included Barbara Green (15.2), Lisa Mason (13.1), Dee Major (10.6), and Shella Stephens (10.5).

1 cup vegetable oil  
1-3/4 cups sifted flour  
2 tps. cinnamon  
1-1/2 tps. baking soda  
1-1/2 tps. baking powder  
3 cups grated carrots  
2/3 cups chopped nuts

Generously grease Easter Bunny Pan with solid vegetable shortening. Dust pan with flour; tap bottom to remove excess flour. Preheat oven to 350°.

In large mixing bowl, beat sugar and eggs until thickened; add oil. Sift flour, baking soda, baking powder and cinnamon together; add to egg mixture. Fold in carrots and nuts.

Pour batter into prepared pan and bake in preheated oven for 45 - 55 minutes.
