New School Board Elections Ordered In Lumberton

It's official. The U.S. District Court in Fayetteville has ordered new elections for three members of the Lumberton School Board in response to a ruling last fall that found Lumberton in violation of the 1965 Voting Rights Act.

The ruling was signed by U.S. District Judge W. Earl Britt, who helped defend Lumberton before being named to the federal bench by then President Jimmy Carter.

Britt ordered the elections to be held on the as yet unannounced date for statewide primary elections.

The ruling stems from the illegal annexations in the late 60's and 70's of the Barker Ten Mile, Lakewood Estates, and Clyborn Pines-Country Club sections by the Lumberton City Schools.

Local parents filed suit, through the auspices of Lumbee River Legal Services and the American Civil Liberties Union, contesting the annexations.

Under the most recent ruling, only residents of the Lumberton School District, excluding the illegal annexations, can participate as a voter or candidate.

The seats held now by Albert Kahn, Sarah Peck and E.A. Sundy are affected by the ruling. Since Ms. Peck lives in the illegally annexed area, she will not be allowed to participate.

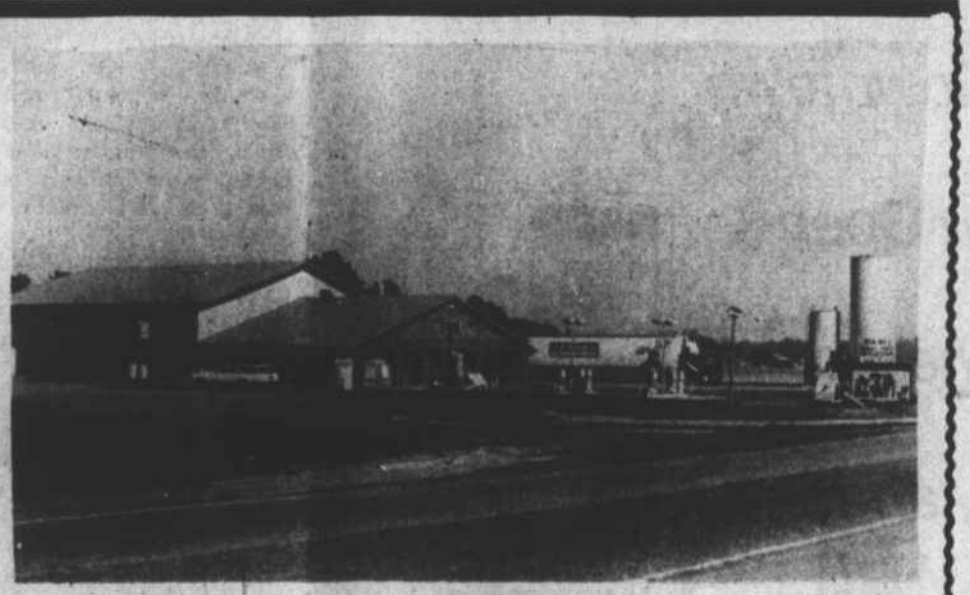
LEASE DISAGREEMENT OVER RENNERT LANDFILL

Mr. Ronald Hammonds, owner of the land being leased to the county for the Rennert landfill, addressed the Commissioners regarding the renewal of the County's lease agreement. Mr.

Hammonds expressed his desire to re-negotiate and unrate the terms of the lease, including the conditions and cost. After much discussion, a committee made up of Commissioners Cox, Herndon and Morgan was selected to study the lease, to work with Mr. Hammonds and his attorney, and to submit their findings to the entire body when their study and negotiations are completed.

TAX DISCOUNT APPROVED

The proposed tax discount for payment of county taxes before September 1 of the year was approved by the N.C. Department of Revenue. Any taxpayer who pays their taxes before September 1 of the year will receive a 2% discount on their taxes due to the county.
