The criteria for selection are a student's academic performance, interest and aptitude, leadership qualities, enthusiasm, motivation to learn and improve, citizenship, attitude and cooperative spirit, dependability, and recommendation from a teacher or director.

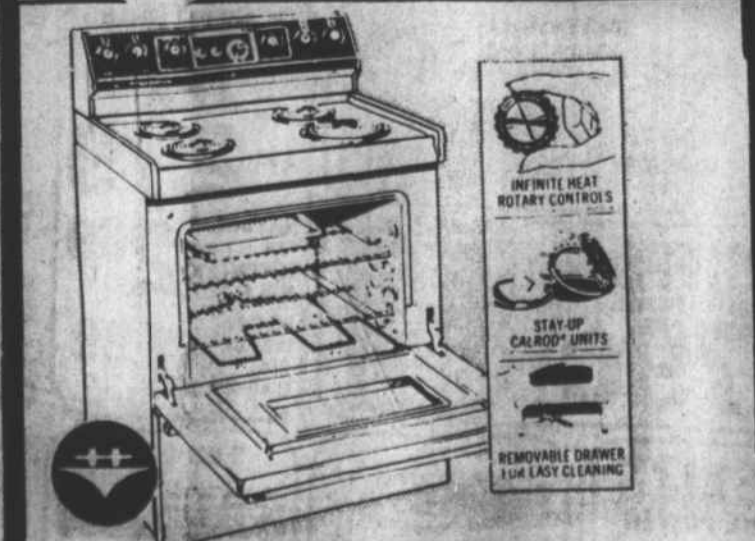

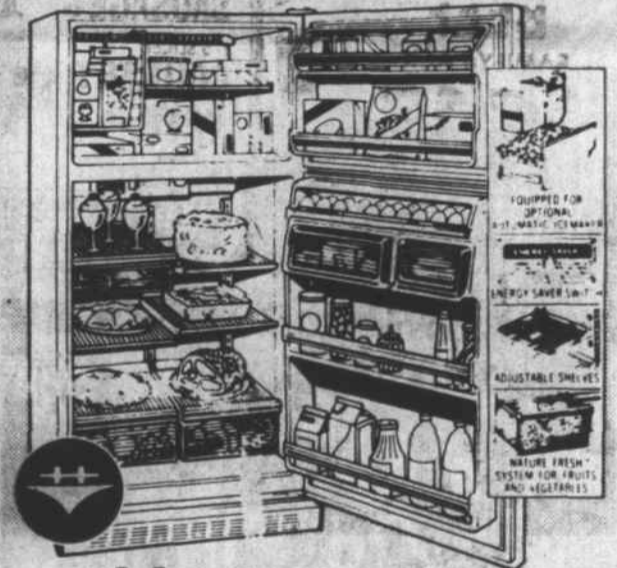
