

The applications were accepted in the LRDA office and then mailed to the Indian Health Service office for selection. Criteria for selection included academic performance, work experience and community background, faculty recommendation, stated reasons for asking for the scholarship, and how their desired career goals related to Indian health manpower needs, based on current needs of Indian people.
