Children from families whose income is at or below the levels shown are e igible for free or reduced-price meals. Application forms are being sent to all homes in a letter to parents. Additional copies are available at the office in each school. The information provided on the application is confidential and will be used only for the purpose of determining eligibility. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year. A statement of family income size including household member names, social security numbers of all adults or an indication that a household member does not have one, is required, rlus a signed certification by the parent, guardian, or other adult household member that the information provided is correct.

An application which does not contain the above complete information cannot be approved. Parents may request assistance from the school official in filling out the form.

Under the provisions of the policy, the principal in each school will review applications and determine eligibility. If a parent is dissatisfied with the decision of the determining official, he or she may wish to discuss it with the official on an informal basis. If a parent wishes to make a formal appeal, he or she may make a request either orally or in writing to: Mr. Archie Oxendine, Community Schools Coordinator, Robeson County Board of Education, Post Office Box 1328, Lumberton, NC 28358, 919-739-9717, for a hearing to appeal the decision. An outline of the hearing procedure is on file at each school.

The information on the application may be checked by the school or other officials at any time during the school year.

Families are required to report income increases by more than \$50 per month (or \$600 per year) or when their household size decreases. Benefits may be applied for at any time during the school year.

If, during the year, a family member becomes unemployed or if the family's size or income changes, the family should contact the school. Such changes may make the children of the family eligible for additional benefits, if the family income falls at or below the levels shown.

In certain cases foster children are eligible for program benefits. Parents should inform the school official if they have foster children in the household.

In the operation of child feeding programs, all children are treated the same regardless of ability to pay. No child is discriminated against because of race, sex, color, national origin, age or handicap.

Each school and the Robeson County School Food Service Office have a copy of the complete policy which may be reviewed by any interested party.
