

## Jacobs-Holmes United in Double-ring Ceremony

WE, the undersigned, being qualified voters, who reside within the County of Robeson do hereby petition your honorable body or bodies, as the case may be, for an election on the question of whether or not the 5 (five) above named school administrative units shall be merged into one administrative unit with such election governed by the provisions of G.S. 115C-507 with authority of the Robeson County Board of Commissioners to hold said election.

FURTHER, that said election will be called to approve or not approve merger of the above named 5 (five) administrative units according to a certain study entitled, "Robeson County, Fairmont, Lumberton, Maxton, Red Springs, St. Pauls 1970 School Survey" as was conducted by North Carolina Department of Public Instruction, Division of School Planning and as might be modified by the N.C. State Board of Education and the 5 (five) above named Boards of Education to comply with G.S. 115C-67 and to utilize existing and planned facilities.

FURTHER, that members of the new Board of Education be elected from the same districts as the Robeson County Commissioners as those districts have been approved by the U.S. Justice Department under the Voting Rights Act.
