Thurman Locklear

Thurman Locklear who retired on September 24 after working a period of 63 years was honored with dinner at the Western Sizzlin by his children. He was presented two plaques, one entitled, "An Admirable Man," the other plaque being engraved with words of appreciation for his devotion to the important things in life.

Locklear's first occupation was farming and being involved in the hog business. He loved and enjoyed this for some time. In the month of November, the year being 1980, Locklear's wife went to be with the Lord.

Locklear being the age of seventy one was not yet ready to retire. He had been told by his doctor that he was in excellent health. Therefore he set out again for work. In January of 1981 he went to work with the Clinton Thomas Day Care Center of which he now retires from. At the age of 73 he is now ready to give up the "Must Be On The Job Business."

Why does he retire with honors? Locklear almost always put the Lord first in whatever he was attempting. He truly believed the Bible verse which reads "Seek ye first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness and all these other things shall be added unto you." He began

his married life with the Lord, being saved at the age of 21. Family devotions were always a part of the daily activities in the home. This was a great influence with his ten children as eight of them today have accepted the Lord as their Savior.

CHEF'S SALAD BOWL, MEXICALI

- 1 can (8-1/4 oz.) Dole Sliced Pineapple in Syrup
- 2 to 3 cups Bud of California Shredded Lettuce
- 1/2 cup thinly sliced zucchini or jicama
- 1/4 cup sliced green onion
- 1 cooked whole chicken breast, cubed
- 1/2 cup Jack or Cheddar cheese strips
- 1 small tomato, sliced
- 1 small avocado, sliced
- Chili Dressing
- Corn chips
- Pumpkin seeds, shelled & toasted

Drain pineapple, reserving 1/4 cup syrup. Combine lettuce, zucchini and onion; spoon into 2 salad bowls. Top with chicken, pineapple, cheese, tomato and avocado slices. Serve with Chili Dressing. Sprinkle with corn chips and pumpkin seeds. Makes 2 generous servings.
