FALL SPORTS SEASONS COMING TO AN END

PSU's fall sports are coming to a fast ending as women's tennis, soccer, cross country and volleyball complete their season schedules.

The women's tennis team has ended their fall half of the schedule, but came up winless in seven matches. With the addition of some talented players in the spring, the Lady Braves look to be much improved. Volleyball owns a 20-10 record through the first 30 matches and has made volleyball history. Not since 1976 has a PSU volleyball team won 20 matches. Congratulations to Coach Tommy Thompson and the volleyball team!

The cross country team recently took second place in the NAA District 26 cross country championships and ninth place in the state championship meet. The Braves will be in Georgia on Oct. 30 for the NCAA II Regionals. PSU must finish among the top two teams to advance on to the NCAA Division II National Championships.

Soccer has been doing well and have completed their conference schedule with an impressive 4-2-1 league record, the best ever. Overall the Braves are 5-8-2.

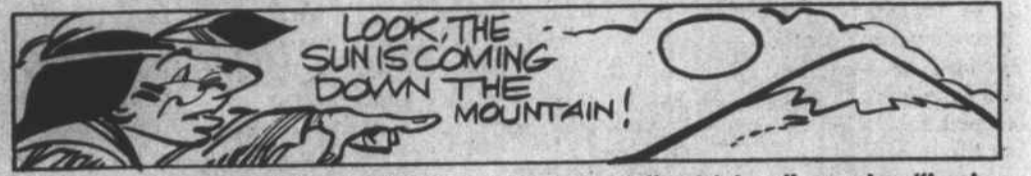
Beverly Garner, East Central Regional Jaycette Director, was the speaker for the
