Political Satirist To Speak At Fund-Raising Dinner

Gerald Gardner, described as one of the greatest creators of humor and political satire of our time, will be the speaker at the fifth annual Pembroke State University Kickoff Banquet to its Million Dollar Centennial Giving Campaign over a threeyear period from 1984-87.

The \$50-a-plate dinner will be held at 6 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 1, in the English E. Jones Physical Education Center.

After the banquet, those holding dinner tickets will be special guests at the PSU Performing Arts Center for a Pulitzer Prizewinning musical comedy entitled "Of Thee I Sing."

"Having this political humorist speak on Nov. 1 just before the elections is good timing." said plan-ners of the dinner. One of Gerald Gardner's

books was found in President John F. Kennedy's 45th birthday cake.

MacLean, Sandlin To **Lead Drive**

MacLean, a former state senator and one of the leaders in helping PSU obtain university status in 1969, is chairman of the board and chief executive officer for Southern National Bank and the Corporation. He is a graduate of Davidson College and the UNC Law School. Former mayor of Lumberton, MacLean is president of the Medical Foundation of N.C. and a director of N.C. Natural Gas Corp.

Sandlin is president and chief financial officer of Southern National Bank and the Corporation. He is a graduate of William and Mary College.


