Parent Committee Election Completed

The Title IV Part A Indian Education Parent Committee of the Robeson County School System for the 1984-85 school year will be comprised of 52 representatives. Members of the Communications Skills Committee met recently with Ms, Cathey Maples, Supervisor of Communication Skills and Foreign Language in the Robeson County School system, to plan for future amendments to the present communicative arts continum.

In the October 24 meeting,


