PSU'S HOMECOMING ONLY THREE WEEKS AWAY
With PSU's homecoming only three weeks away, alumni newsletters and alumni survey cards have been mailed to all PSU alumni of whom the PSU Alumni Office has addresses. These are 7,000 in number.

PROFESSOR OF LAW SPEAKS IN "CHURCH AND STATE" SERIES

Dan Pollitt, Graham Kenan Professor of Law at UNC-Chapel Hill, will be the lecturer Tuesday night at 7:30 p.m. in the third of an eight-part series on "Church and State and the First Amendment" at PSU's Old Main building. The talks are free to the public.

Pollitt will speak on "The First Amendment: The Legal Experience."

An infantry officer in the U.S. Marines during World War II, Pollitt earned his A.B. from Wesleyan University in Connecticut, his L.L.B. from Cornell Law School, and also attended the Academy of International Law in the Netherlands. He earned all of his degrees with honors.

HECTOR MACLEAN TO BE INTERVIEWED

Hector MacLean, chairman of the Robeson County Bicentennial Commission and also co-chairman of PSU's Committee of 100 which is raising \$1 million for PSU, will be interviewed on WPSU-TV at 3 p.m. Monday, Jan. 20. Copies of this interview will be provided for cablevision stations in Lumberton and Fayetteville, which together with Pembroke serve over 60,000 homes.

SCHMALLEGER EDITS NEW PUBLICATION

Dr. Frank Schmallegger, chairman of the PSU Department of Sociology and Social Work, is the editor-in-chief of a new publication, "The Justice Professional," which is being printed under a PSU faculty development grant.

Dr. Richard Kanis of Guilford College is the book review editor, while the editorial board is headed by Dr. Reed Adams of UNC-Charlotte and Dr. Barney Paus of PSU.

Those contributing to the 60-page journal hail from across the nation: California, Oklahoma, Arkansas, Pennsylvania, Maryland, and North Carolina.

Dr. Schmallegger says: "It is our hope that this journal will contribute to a greater understanding of the justice needs by the general public, while, at the same time, increasing understanding among justice practitioners concerning the need for behavior which is in line with the values of our larger society."

NEW ANTHROPOLOGY PROFESSOR

Dr. Margaret Houstoff is a visiting professor at PSU this semester, teaching Anthropology (Sociology 105). She also teaches at St. Andrews Presbyterian College and is director of the Indian Museum of the Carolinas at Laurinburg. She earned her B.A. at the University of Pennsylvania and both her M.A. and Ph. D. from UNC-Chapel Hill, all in anthropology.

DIAL'S BUSY SPEAKING SCHEDULE

Dr. Adolph Dial continues to speak widely about American Indians as chairman of the American Indian Studies Department at PSU.
