We advise that the Tobacco be put up in dry order, clean of dirt, and bad leaves,

21ly. We advise the people, to avoid the bad practice of mixing good and bad, long and thort Tobacco together.

3dly. Tat the Tobacco be carefully feparated; that the thort and mail indifferent be stemmed and prized steaight and loole. The casks must be well featoned and the fize not to exceed thirty-four inches acrofs the heart, and fifty-tour inches in full length of flaves. The pios in the rolled ho heads must be ferfoned likewise and not oo large, nor more than will an-Iwer the purpote.

By attending to the above, the Planters will find themfolves much benefited by the price of faid Arricle; the Intrectors will be relieved from retuling Tebacco; and the character of Payetteville Inspection will be retrieved.

The Infectors think it their duty to give this information in order to fave trouble and expence to the Panters of Tobacco, as an alteration mult be made in the bufinefs.
