Regimental Orders.

THE officers commanding Companies belonging and attached to the New-Hanover Regiment of Militia are hereby required to appear at Wilmington, with their respective companies completely armed and equipped agreeably to law, at the usual Parade, on Tuesday the first day of May next, to be formed in line, and their rolls called precisely at 12 o'clock, in order to a General Review. Punctual attendance is expected, and a correct return of the numbers of men and arms belonging to each company will be required from the commanding officers thereof.
