**Notice is hereby given,**

THAT agreeably to the act of Congress entitled "An act to provide additional revenues for defraying the expences of government and maintaining the public credit, by laying duties on spirits distilled within the United States and territories thereof, and by amending the act laying duties on licenses to distillers of spirituous liquors," passed Dec. 31, 1814, every person who shall, after the 1st day of February, 1815, distill spirits within the United States, is required, in addition to the duty on the license already taken, or hereafter to be taken by him, to pay twenty cents a gallon on all spirits distilled after that day, or, subject to the limitations in the said act expressed, to pay 25 cents a gallon on all such spirits, in which case no license is required to be taken; and that agreeably to the said act a bond is required, previous to the said distillation, to be given to the collector, and other duties required to be performed under penalties therein prescribed.

That the distiller may be correctly advised of the duties incumbent upon him to discharge, an abstract of the several acts of Congress, subjecting stills, and boilers, and spirits to duty has been prepared, a copy of which, with the annexed forms of statements to be filled up, will be furnished to him, by the collector, on demand.

The collector will also furnish, on demand, blank bonds, and such other blanks as will enable the distiller to comply with the several provisions of law.
