mentioned; and the other made in the third and fourth Years of the Reign of Queen Anne, intituled, An Act for continuing Duties upon Low Wines, and upon Coffee, Tea, Chocolate, Spices, and Pictures, and upon Hawkers, Pedlars, and Petty Chapmen, and upon Muslins; and for granting new Duties upon feveral of the faid Commodities, and alfo upon Callicoes, China Ware, and Drugs; any Law, Custom, or Usage, to the contrary, notwithstanding.

Provideded always, and be it further enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That, until the first Day of March, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty Five, upon the Exportation from this Kingdom, to any British Colony or Plantation in America, of such white Callicoes or Muslins only as were fold on or before the twenty fifth Day of March, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty Four, at the Sale of the united Company of Merchants trading to the East Indies, such and the same Drawbacks schall be allowed as are now payable upon the Exportation of the faid Goods.

And be it further enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That if any Merchant or other Perfon shall, from and after the faid first Day of May, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty Four, enter any Goods for Exportation to Parts beyond the Seas, other than to the faid British Colonies or Plantations in America, in order to obtain any Drawback not allowed by this ACt upon the Exportation of fuch Goods to the faid British Colonies or Plantations, and the faid Goods shall nevertheless be carried to any British Colony or Plantation in America, and landed there, contrary to the true Intent and Meaning hereof, that then, and in fuch Cafe, the Drawback shall be forfeited, and the Exporter of fuch Goods, and the Mafter of the Ship or Veffel on board which the fame were loaded and exported, shall forfeit double the amount of the Drawback paid or to be. paid for the fame, and alfo treble the Value of the faid Goods. And it is further enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That from and after the faid first Day of May, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty Four, if any Goods, not allowed to draw back any Part of the old Subfidy, or any other Duty by this Act, fhall be entered for Exportation from this Kingdom to any other Place beyond the Seas, except to fome British Colony or Plantation in America, in every Cafe where the Exporter is required, by

any Law now in force, to fwear that fuch Goods are not landed or intended to be landed in Great Britain, Ireland, or the lfle of Man, there fhall also be added to, and included in, the Oath upon the Debenture for fuch Goods, any British Colonies or Plantations in America.

And be it further enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That from and after the twenty ninth Day of September, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty Four, no Rum or Spirits of the Produce or Manufacture of any of the Colonies or Plantations in America, not in the Possession or under the Dominion of his Majefty, his Heirs or Succeffors, shall be imported or brought into any of the Colonies or Plantations in America which now are, or hereafter may be in the Poffession or under the Dominion of his Majefty, his Heirs or Succeffors, upon forfeiture" of all such Rum or Spirits, together with the Ship or Veffel in which the fame shall be imported, with the Tackle, Apparel, and Furniture thereof; to be feized by any Officer or Officers of his Majefty's Cuftoms, and profecuted in fuch Manner and Form as herein after is expressed; any Law, Cuftom, or Ulage, to the contrary, notwithstanding.

And it is hereby further enacted and declared by the Authority aforefaid, That from and after the twenty ninth Day of September, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty Four, nothing in the before-recited act made in the fixth Year of the Reign of his late Majefty King George the Second, or any other Act of Parliament, shall extend, or be construed to extend, to give Liberty to any Person or Perfons whatsoever to import into the Kingdom of Ireland, any Sort of Sugars, but such only as shall be fairly and bona fide loaden and ship; ped in Great-Britain, and carried directly from thence in Ships navigated according to Law. LONDONS APRIL 19.

This Day the King went to the Houfe of Peers, accompanied in the State Coach by his Grace the Duke of Rutland, Matter of the Horfe, and one of the Lords in Waiting: His Majetty being feated on the Throne, made a most Gracious Speech to both Houfes of Parliament, and gave the Royal Affent to the following Bills: TO the Bill for vefting the Fort of Senegal, and its Dependencies, in the African Company: To the Bill for afcertaining and regulating in what
