THE Acts of Assembly, passed last Sessions, at Wilmington.

THE Honourable Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, having been inform'd that Compositions have been frequently enter'd into for the Duties imposed by the Act of 6 Geo. II. payable to His Majesty at the Ports of America, give this Publick Notice, That whoever will make Discovery of any Person or Persons, who shall have been guilty of entering into, or conniving at such Compositions, to John Temple, Esq; or Peter Randolph, Esq; Surveyors-General of His Majesty's Customs in North-America, or other Principal Officer of His Majesty's Customs, the Collector, or Comptroller, of any Port, except the Port where such Fraud was enter'd into, so that the Parties offending may be convicted thereof, and the Duties recover'd to the Crown, shall receive One Third Part of the Duties so recover'd.
