the obfervation of the fabbath is renewed, whereby working, diverfions in carriages, or on the water, and frequenting public houfes on Sundays and Holidays, are forbidden under the feverelt penalties. The Juflices of the peace are once a month to give in an account of the behaviour of the inhabitants, to be figned by the miniter of the place: which is to be tranfmitted to the chamber of War and Domains, who are to lay it before the king.

## L O N D O N.

May 21. Saturday laf were examined in Bow freet, before Sir John Fi: lding. Thomas Kynafion, William Kelynge, John Spinnage, and John Phillips, Eigrs. four footmen, charged with ribtous behaviout at Raveligh houie, by hifing feveral of the Nobility, relative to thein not giving or fuffering vails to be taken, pelting feveral gentemen with brickbats, and breaking the windows, \&c. Then one, whe had threatened violence ag tinft the perfons of the Lords Corawillis and Allen, and who had alfo affaulted a Perfon who tad endeavoured to diffuade him from his riotous proceed. ings, was fent to Newgate, another was bound to liis good behaviour, and publicly difchaiged fiom his miffer's Service, one fet at libercy, no one appearing againf him, and ihe other dif siffed by the magittrates, on aiking pirdon, and promifung to difcover his accomplices.

Yefferday George Pitt, Efq; his majofy's embiff dor at the court of Turin, arrived at his houfe. in Arlington fireet, from thit kingdom.

The lift leters from Waifaw of the ift inft, ad. tife, that she merchants and great dealers of thite ciey, were fecuring their bell effeets by fending. them down the river Vittula to Dumzick, and logging them in the monafteries, being apprehenfige that the flames of war will be foon kindled in that neighbourhood.
Money is fo very plentifal in Hoiland, that they lend it on Engling gaod fecurities, and even on India fock at three per cent. on Dutch two and a half per cent. and difcount on all forts of bills two per cent.

They write from Scluchteren in Germany, of the 2 d inf. that a water fpout, or cloud, happened to ureak near that place, by which fix of the ad. jacent villages were quite ruined.
Yeflerday the right hon. the Lord High Chancellor kiffed his majefty's hand on beirg created an carl, by the tide of Earl of Northington, Vifcount Henley, and Baron of Grange, in Hampthire.
It is faid that France, in concert with the court of Vienna, intereffs heffelf with aldour for prince Charles of Saxony, in order to get him feated on the throne of Poland.

According to adrices from Poland, we may collect from all circumftances, that the approaching election for the crown of Poland will excite vall commotions. It is faid that letters have been receized from Conftantingple, in which the Grand

Signior threatens Ruffia with war. Others pretend to have received advices of the march of a numepous army of Tartars. But thefe rumours want confirmation.

A few days fince Mr. Morea, an eminent painter, prefented a picture of his Majefty on horfeback, atterided by Lord Ligonier, to the Queen; who was fo much pleafed with the execution, that the ordered Mr. Morea a purfe of 100 guineas, as a reward for his ingenuity.
The hips now building at Chatham, are, the Victory of 116 guns, the London and Barfeur of $9^{\circ}$ guns each, and the Raifonable of 74. The Victory is the largeft fliip, that ever was buill in England.
The report fome time fince current, that the French were to cede New Oileans to the Spaniards, feems to be founded on truth, as we are informed in the Gzette, that M. Jrafi, a Spanifh colonel, is appointed to the government of that place.
