the observation of the sabbath is renewed, whereby working, diversions in carriages, or on the water, and frequenting public houses on Sundays and Holidays, are forbidden under the scerest penalties. The Justices of the peace are once a month to give in an account of the behaviour of the inhabitants, to be signed by the minister of the place; which is to be transmitted to the chamber of War and Domains, who are to by it before the king.

Saturday last were examined in Bow" freet, before Sir John Fielding, Thomas Kynafton, William Kelynge, John Spinnage, and John Phillips, Efgrs. four footmen, charged with riotous behaviour at Ranelagh house, by hitting feveral of the Nobility, relative to their not giving or fuffering vails to be taken, pelting feveral gentlemen with brickbats, and breaking the windows, &c. when one, who had threatened violence against the perfons of the Lords Cornwallis and Allen, and who had alfo affaulted a Perfon who had endeavoured to diffuade him from his riotous proceedings, was fent to Newgate, another was bound to his good behaviour, and publicly discharged from his mafter's Service, one fet at liberty, no one appearing against him, and the other difficed by the magistrates, on alking pardon, and promiting to difcover his accomplices.

Yefterday George Pitt, Efq; his majefty's embaff dor at the court of Turin, arrived at his house in Arlington fireet, from that kingdom.

The left letters from Warfaw of the ift inft, advile, that the merchants and great dealers of that city, were fecuring their bell effects by fending. them down the river Villula to Duntzick, and lodging them in the monasteries, being apprehenfive that the flames of war will be foon kindled in that neighbourhood. Money is to very plentiful in Holland, that they lend it on English good fecurities, and even on India flock at three per cent. on Dutch two and a half per cent. and discount on all forts of bills two per cent. They write from Scluchteren in Germany, of the 2d inft. that a water fpout, or cloud, happened to break near that place, by which fix of the ad. jacent villages were quite ruined. Yesterday the right hon. the Lord High Chancellor kiffed his majefty's hand on being created an carl, by the title of Earl of Northington, Viscount-Henley, and Baron of Grange, in Hampshire. It is faid that France, in concert with the court of Vienna, interefts herfelf with ardour for prince Charles of Saxony, in order to get him feated on the throne of Poland. According to advices from Poland, we may colleft from all circumstances, that the approaching election for the crown of Poland will excite vall commotions. It is faid that letters have been receized from Conftantinople, in which the Grand

Signior threatens Ruffia with war. Others pretend to have received advices of the march of a numerous army of Tartars. But these rumours want confirmation.

Last S. turday, about 5 o'clock in the morning, a tradefman, near Wardour fireet, Soho, attempted to hang himfelf on the iron rails of his own house, but was prevented by the rope's breaking. He then pulled out a knife, cut himself across the belly, asterwards thabbed himself in both arms, and in half an hour, expired in the most exquisite torment.

One day last week, a young person at Shrewfbury, poison'd herself the day after she was married.

A report prevails, that his Grace the Duke of Bedford is going over to France ; but on what occafion is not declared.

Yetterday near 1000 wt. of filver was entered, and fiamped at Golofmith's hall; the greatest quantity in one day that has been known for many years.
