BRIDGE-TOWN, August 4, 1764.

Various are the Reports among the Public, concerning the inhuman Murder committed on Sunday laft by a Negro on the Body of a white Woman; but the most particular we can obtain, is the following: That on Sunday the 29th ult' a Fellow named Sharper, belonging (as it is faid) to Captain Callender, on his Return from a Negro Play, met with Mifs Sarah Sutton, of the Parish of Chrift Church (who was attended by her Sifter, and two small Negroes) gathering Hog-Meat in a Piece of Second crop Canes; that he feized the Negroes, and tied them, upon which Mifs Sutton defired him not to hurt them, and the would give him a Bitt; his Answer was, " Damn your Bitt, I don't want it :" That he then feized her, and dragged her fome diftance in the Cane Piece, near the Place where her Sifter was busied in cutting Meat also, and there he fastened each of her Legs and Hands to a different Bunch of Cancs, whilst, devoid of every Sense but Brutality, he robbed her of her Virginity. When he had fated his brutal Lufts, he stabbed her with a Knife on each Side of her Head, then with his Hand on her Throat, strangled her till Part of her Tongue hung out of her Mouth, which he inftantly cut off, and, perceiving her still alive, with three different Cuts across her Throat, he left only about an Inch of Flesh to keep her Head to her Shoulders, having entirely disjointed the Neck Bone. All this Time her Sifter lay, concealed in an adjacent Spot, not daring to move for Fear of fharing the fame Fate. The Villain is fince apprehended, and is now confined in Goal to wait the Sentence of his just Deferts.

## NEWBERN, Sept. 28.

We have certain Advice from Norfolk in Virginia, That the Hon. Col. Tryan, our Lieutenant Governor, has got a Man of War appointed to bring him to his Government by Way of Virginia, where he is hourly expected : Therefore the Paragraph in the Wilmington Post-Boy, of the Governor's having taken his Paffage in Capt. Veronier, a small Brig. belonging to Cape Fear, and was to come by Way of Madeiri, proves premature; as indeed it is a Paragraph of the first Impression, to tell us a Governor had taken his faffage to his Government in a Tar-Droguer, and intended a trading Voyage by Way of the Madeiras. But Mourn, Mourn, ye Wilmingtonians, and put on Sack cloth and Athes, for the Measure of thy Good Things is fuil, and the exil Day is coming upon thee! Mr. TRYAN, if we have any Skill in Augury, is coming to live in PEACE among us, and deliver us from unlevened Bread ; which nothing but his Refidence on the GRASSY PLAINS can reftore and accomplish, We hear from Core Sound, That Capt. Lobb,

in a Man of War, is arrived in Cape Lookout Bay, being flationed between Virginia and South-Carolina, for the Protection of our Trade.

Since our laft, the Schooner Joseph, Capt, Williams, arrived here from Barbadoes, with a Parcel of fine healthy young Slaves; he brings no material News, Markets very low. He fays he was chaced many Hours by a fine clean Sloop, who both rowed and crouded all the could to come up with him, and was fo near that the Shot the fired went over him: This great Curiofity of the Sloop, in Time of Peace, to speak with Capt. Williams, excited his Diligence to avoid her, which a lighter Pair of Heels enabled him to do.
