And any Person that will inform Me, so that his Testimony will support a legal Prosecution, of any Person or Persons hereafter dealing with any of my Slaves, without the Certificate aforesaid, shall be paid a Reward of *Forty Shillings* Proclamation Money, for each Prosecution which his Evidence will support, by
