groes: I am, for the future, determined to prosecute, with the utmost Rigour of the Law, any Person or Persons that shall deal in any Manner or or Respect whatsoever with any of my Negroes, without their first producing to the Purchaser a Certificate, signed by Me, of their having Leave to dispose of the Commodity offered for Sale. And any Person that will inform Me, so that his Testimony will support a legal Prosecution, of any Person or Persons hereafter dealing with any of my Slaves, without the Certificate aforesaid, shall be paid a Reward of Forty Shillings Proclamation-Money, for each Prosecution which his Evidence will support, by
Thomas Clifford Howe.

STOLEN from Onslow Court house, in the Day Time, a dark bay Horse, about 13 Hands 3 Inches high, short Tale, half his Mane cut, shod before, with a large Saddle Spot on the rising Side of his Back, and branded with the Letters M.
