WHEREAS sundry Persons have, and do still continue to cut and pillage Wood off the Land belonging to Miss *Mary Lister*, adjacent to the Town of Newbern: Notice is hereby given to such Persons, That unless they do desist, they will be prosecuted with the utmost Rigour of the Law: And as a Reward to any Person or Persons who will apprehend the Person for Persons so doing, I will pay, for any white Peron detected of trespassing on said Land, so as they can be lawfully convicted, *Twenty Shillings*, and for every Slave detected as aforesaid, and taken into Custody, *Five Shillings*.
