EAST-FLORIDA.

By his Excellency JAMES GRANT, Esq; Captain General, Governor, and Commander in Chief in and over the said Province, and Vice Admiral of the Jame.

PROCLAMATION.

HEREAS the King, by his royal instructions, has commanded me to issue a proclamation to make known the terms and conditions on

which all persons may obtain grants of lands proclamation, and make known to all persons, That they may, on application to me in council at St. Augustine, obtain grants of lands in the faid province of EAST-FLORIDA, in the following quantities, and on the following otherwise: terms and conditions, viz.

That one bundred acres of land will be granted to every Person, being master or mistress of a family, for himself, or herself; and fifty acres for every white or black man, woman or child of which fu h person's family shall consist in case any person applying as aforesaid, shall he defirous to take up a larger quantity of land an the family right entitles such person to, on shewing a probability of cultivation, an ditional number of acres, not exceeding one ousand, may be obtained, upon paying to the eiver of the quit rents the sum of five shilgs sterling for every fifty acres of such addi-

tional grant, on the day of the date of the faid grant.

That the quit rents of the lands granted in this province, are to be one half penny per acre, payable to his Majesty, his heirs, and succesfors, yearly, on the feast of St. Michael, or within fourteen days of the same, to commence on the first featt of St. Michael, which shall happen two years after the Date of the grant:

That in all grants of land to be made, regard will be had to the profitable and unprofitable acres, so that each grantee may have a proportionable number of one fort and the other; as likewise, that the breadth of each tract of land. in the said province, I DO, in obedience to be one third of the length of such tract, and that his Majesty's said instructions, ISSUE this my the length of each tract do not extend along the banks of any river, but into the main-land, that thereby the faid grantees may have each a convenient share of what accommodation the faid river may afford, either for navigation or

> That all persons, on fulfilling the terms of the first grant, may have a further grant of the like quantity of lands, on the terms and conditions aforesaid:

That for every fifty acres of plantable land, each grantee shall be obliged, within three at the actual time of making the grant; and years after the date of his or her grant, to clear and work three acres at least, on that part of his or her tract, which he or the shall think most convenient or advantageous, or else to clear and drain three acres of swampy or sunken ground, or drain three acres of marsh, if any tuch be within his or her grant:

That for every fifty acres of land accounted barren, every person shall be obliged to put on
