into the gulph of Florida much about the place where the current ceases to have any effect; Big Savannah about 24 miles westward of Apalachee; Little Savannah about 100 miles southwest of Apalachee; Calasahatchee about 100 miles to the fouthward of Little Savannah; the three rivers last named running in--to the gulph of Mexico.

The principal harbours yet discovered are, St. Mary's, St. John's, St. Augustine, Maganzas, Muskicoes, Honda, Key-West, Tamper and Apalachee, of which no particular de. scriptions can be given, as they have not yet

been surveyed and sounded.
