To all to whom these Prefents shall come. Greeting.

W HEREAS Complaint hath this Day been made to Us, by Thomas Clifford Howe, Elq; That Three Negro Slaves, to wit, one Negro Man named PETER, one other named ABRA-HAM, and another called BEN, hath absented themfelves from their faid Matter, and are supposed to continue lurking about and committing many Acts of Felony in this Province. Peter, is a yellow Fellow, about 35 Years of Age, speaks broken English, and is about 5 Feet 8 Inches high : Had on when he went away, about Two Months ago, a woollen Jacket and Trouzers and an Oznabrig Shirt. Abraham is a black Fellow, about 26 Years of Age, speaks good English, and is about 5 Feet 11 Inches high : Had on when he went away, about 6 Weeks ago, a woollen Jacket and Breeches, and an Oznabrig Shirt, is supposed to be about White Oak. Ben, is a black Fellow, about 5 Feet 6 Inches high, Country born, speaks good English, and is supposed to be gone to Cape-Fear.

THESE are therefore in his Majefty's Name, to command the faid Slaves forthwith to furrender themfelves and return home to their Mafter: And ment of any Crime or Offence for fo doing, or without incurring any Penalty or Forfeiture thereby.

GIVEN under our Hands and Seals, this Seventh Day of Junuary, 1765, and in the 5th Year of his Majesty's Reign. JOHN WILLIAMS, SAMUEL CORNELL.

N. B. Whoever apprehends the faid Negroes, or either of them, fo that I may have them again, fhall receive Forty Shillings Reward for each, if taken in the County, and Five Pounds if brought 100 Miles, befides all reafonable Charges, and fo in Proportion for a greater or fmaller Diffance: And any Perfon that will kill the faid Slaves, or either of them, fhall receive Five Pounds Reward for each, paid by

T H A T on the 25th of December 1 ft, he received from the SPEAKER of the Houle, Copies of the LAWS paffed at the 1 ft Seffion of Affembly at Wilmington; which are now in the PRESS, and will be published by the First of February next; when they will be then sent to the several Counties, agreeable to a Resolve of the House for that Purpose.

we do hereby also require the Sheriff of the faid County of Craven, to make diligent Search and Purfuit after the above-mentioned Slaves; and them having found to apprehend and fecure, fo that they may be conveyed to their faid Mafter, or otherwise discharged as the Law directs. And the faid Sheriff is hereby impowered, to raife and take with him fuch Power of his County as he shall think fit for the apprehending the faid outlying Slaves. And we do hereby further, in Virtue of an Act of Affembly of this Province concerning Servants and Slaves, intimate and declare, That if the faid Peter, Abraham and Ben, or either of them, shall not furrender him or themfelves, or return home immediately after the Publication of these Prefents, that then any Perfon whatloever may kill or destroy the faid Negroes, or either of them, by fuch Means as he or they may think fit, without any Acculation or Impeach-
