itled to First-class accommodations, and when he is denied it, he also has a valid cause of action—supported by decisions handed down by the United States Supreme Court.

The filing of the suit by the lone Negro Representative in Congress has caused widespread comment throughout the nation, both the white and colored press devoting considerable space to the various aspects of the case which doubtless, after going thru the Illinois Civil Courts to the State Supreme Court, will find its way ultimately to a decision by the United States Court.

The case will have Federal jurisdiction after it leaves the Illinois State Supreme Court, and when a constitutional question is raised. The present action carries additional weight, according to Attorney Westbrook because Congressman Mitchell retained his First-class ticket, which will be the star exhibit in the case. A preliminary hearing is expected within the near future.

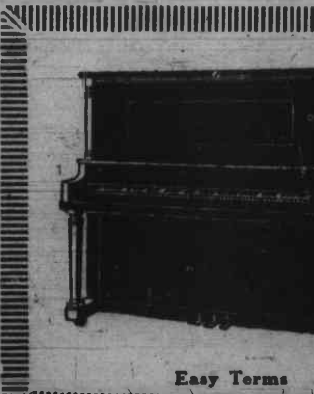

SURVEYS BARE DANGEROUS CONDITION AT EAST DURHAM SCHOOL

Continued from page one An average of 59 children in what teachers at the East Durham school are forced to accept. In most instances the 52 students are divided into two classes. The principal has no office, and instead of having time to attend to the duties of that particular office she is burdened with teaching classes also.

There are no library facilities in the East Durham school, and recreational facilities, other than the most ancient type, are unheard of.

Why an epidemic of some devastating contagious disease has not broken out in the school is a mystery beyond the solution of the average person.

In the face of these deplorable conditions the teacher and student are able to smile and are more than courteous to visitors. Complaints are few and far between, and hope is written on the brow of both teachers and students—hope for a new and better building promised them more than three years ago.
