3,000 STUDENTS HEAR DR. MARY McLEOD BETHUNE IN COLUMBIA, S. C.
 Columbia, S. C., June 18.—(ANP)—More than 3,000 colored students of adult education, members of the P.W.A. classes throughout the state, journeyed here Sunday to hear a notable address by Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune, NYA

director of Negro affairs, at Washington Street Methodist church.
 Pleading for the opportunity of self-development for Negroes, the famed founder and president of Bethune-Cookman college declared the Negro could not develop unless given the opportunity and that the uneducated Negro was a menace to the community. She said: "If

the Negroes could be better educated, they would be better workers and better members of society."
 Moreover, she added, an epidemic of any sort, breaking out among the underprivileged, can spread to those more fortunate. She assured the audience that a child cannot grow in a sordid home, and colored children need recreation as

much as white children.
 Teaching briefly on racial differences and the marked tendency of young Negro men and women to become increasingly "race conscious," Mrs. Bethune declared that the Negro did not want to become white. "The Negro and proud of it," she explained. "And I want to congratulate the South because its Negroes are getting

blacker." Her remarks were well received by the members of both races present.
 R. A. House, director of the education, J. D. Fleton welcomed the Perry of Booker T. Washington students to Columbia, while Prof. High School welcomed them on behalf of the colored citizens. Mrs. Bethune was introduced to the huge audience by Prof. C. A. John-
