

After an illness of three nonths S P. Burton died at his ome at 1012 Whitted Street, Wednisday June 23rd. Death came at 7:20 PM.


Mr. (Burton, who was 80 years old at the time of his death, has lived in Durham for a long time and was well beloved by all who knew him
