Association for Advancement of Colored People reveals that in such re-employment as is taking place in various sections of the country very few jobs are being given to Negroes. This unfortunate circumstance creates situation where reductions on racial basis would work greater harm to Negroes than any other racial group. We therefore urge reductions be made on basis of proportion of reemployment in private and public industry as such re-employment relatively affects white and Negro Americans."
