CHINESE RESIST LATEST INVASION BY THE JAPANESE

PEIPING, July 22.—(NA) Following several days of sharp fighting between Chinese and Japanese troops in North China, the Nanking Government officially warned Tokio that China would be forced to take defensive measures if Japanese provocation and invasion of Chinese territory continued. Chinese officials demanded that the Japanese Government order a cessation of Japanese military activities in the Peiping area.

Repulse of a large force of Japanese invaders by crack Chinese troops of the 29th Route Army was reported. Nanking ordered several regiments north to reinforce the 29th Route Army, as the Tokio Government began rushing tens of thousands of Japanese troops into the Peiping area from Manchuria.

The latest Japanese attack finds China more united than ever before with all sections of the population demanding a firm stand against further seizure of Chinese territory.

The Tokio Government has four drastic demands on China, threatening war as an alternative to Chinese submission. The demands call for complete withdrawal of Chinese troops from their own territory along the Yunting River, severe punishment of Chinese commanders who resisted the latest Japanese advance, absolute suppression of patriotic, united China, anti-Japanese movements, and co-operation with the Japanese militarists in their fight on Communism.

SCOTTSBORO COMPROMISE

DECATUR, Ala., July 29.—C—The much discussed compromise in the Scottsboro cases materialized Monday when the State of Alabama, for the first time, failed to ask the death penalty for Andy Wright, who has been sentenced to death in the same case twice before. Whether this policy will affect the other six boys is not yet known, as lawyers for the prosecution made no comment on their surprise move.

The cases are now more muddled than ever. Heywood Patterson, for whom death was asked by the State, is now under a 75 year jail sentence. Clarence Norris was convicted and for a third time sentenced to death last week.

100,000 Letters To Senators On Mob Bill Asked

NEW YORK, July 23.—A plea for 100,000 telegrams, letters and post cards to be sent to senators asking them to act on the federal anti-lynching bill before adjourning Congress was broadcast today by the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.

As was predicted immediately after the death of Senator Joseph B. Robinson, the Senate on July 22 buried the bitterly debated supreme court bill by a vote of 70 to 20 and Senate leaders immediately announced a drive to clean up one or two bills and adjourn.

In all the announcements which have come from Washington, no mention is made of the anti-lynching bill and some of the writers declare that the Senate is even planning to drop the wages and hours bill.

Only by flooding senators with requests for action on the anti-lynching bill will supporters of this legislation get any consideration at this session. The date for adjournment has been set tentatively for August 15, and some senators want to close August 10.

It is estimated that there are at least 65 sure votes for the anti-lynching bill in the Senate. Furthermore, the leading southern senators who are opposed to the bill and who come from the deep south states have promised not to filibuster against it but to confine their actions to speeches attacking the bill and votes against it. No attempt will be made to block it by prolonged filibustering tactics. With this assurance, the bill could be passed in perhaps two days of debate. It already has been approved by the Senate judiciary committee 13 to 3 and needs only to be called up on the floor. Senator Hennett Champ Clark, of Missouri,

and others have promised we have ever been to actual passage of a federal anti-lynching law." the NAACP appeal to the country said. "The bill passed the House by an overwhelming vote. It was approved by the Senate judiciary committee in a 60-20 vote. It is more than 60 senators—an unprecedented number have pledged to vote for this bill. Straw votes by the American Institute of Public Opinion shows that the country is 70 per cent in favor of this bill. A poll by a neutral Washington news service has shown that 57 positive votes are in the senate for the bill."

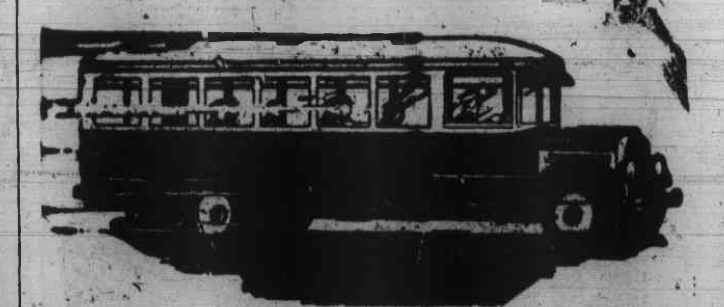
