DELICIOUS ICE CREAMS

How long since you've made a smooth, luscious, rich ice cream? I think there is nothing quite so delicious as homemade ice cream for desert these summer days, providing the ice cream is smooth and free from bits of ice crystals.

Peanut Butter Ice Cream

One cup sugar, one eighth teaspoon salt, one cup peanut butter, one cup of hot water, three and one half cups irradiated evaporated milk, two cups cold water.
Measure the sugar, salt and peanut butter in a bowl. Add the cup of hot water. Stir to blend very thoroughly. Add cold water and milk. Place in trays and freeze. Stirring occasionally. Makes two and one fourth suzats. Serve with chocolate sauce.

Coffee Ice Cream

One cup milk, one fourth cup Mocha Coffee, three egg yolks, one eighth teaspoon salt, one cup sugar, three cups thin cream.

Scald milk with cocoa and add half the sugar. Without straining use this mixture for making a custard with the eggs, salt and the remaining sugar. Add a cup of cream and let stand thirty mins. Cool, strain through double cheese cloth, add the remaining cream and freeze in your automatic refrigerator.

Fruit Punch Ice Cream

Two thirds cup sweetened milk, one fourth cup tea, one fourth cup orange juice, one tablespoon of sherry or sherry extract, one cup whipping cream.

Blend sweetened condensed milk, tea, orange juice and sherry very thoroughly. Chill whip cream to custard like consistency and fold into chilled mixture. Pack into freezing unit. After mixture is about half dozen, remove from refrigerator. Scrape mixture from sides and bottom of pan. Beat until smooth but not melted. Smooth out and replace in freezing unit until frozen. Serve six.

Malted Cocoa Ice Cream

Blend one half cup hot water, two thirds cup sweetened condensed milk, one tablespoon sugar, and two teaspoon vanilla. Add to one third cup malted cocoa powder and beat well. Fold in one cup cream, whipped stiff and one half cup chopped nuts. Pour into the recipes such as Peppermint Stick Ice Cream, Burnt Almond, Date Ice Cream, Fresh Peach, Sherry Ice Cream and many many more. Wouldn't you like it? Anti-Lynch Bill To Come Up Thursday

WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 9.—The motion to make the Wagner Van Nuys Anti lynching bill the unfinished business of the Senate to be taken up immediately will be made August 11 or 12 by Senator Robert F. Wagner of New York. Immediately following the vote on the judiciary reform bill, it was announced here today.

When the housing bill is voted upon the judiciary bill will be next in line, coming up probably on Monday August 9. Unless there should be prolonged attempts to amend the court bill, it should be disposed of in two days.

Observers point out, however, that there is no certainty in his schedule as anything can happen in the rush to adjourn. This week a group of southern senators went on a rampage and emasculated the housing bill, amending it so that no new cost housing projects can be built in New York or other large northern areas where slums desperately need to be cleared. The bill was trimmed neatly by limiting the cost per room to \$1,000, a figure impossible to meet in New York. After blocking the

housing bill the southerners blocked only by the half promise of the white House to nominate a supreme court justice. The Senate wants to debate this and to put off adjourning.
All these moves have helped keep alive the fight for the anti lynching bill. In addition the senate has been flooded by letters from individuals and organizations urging action on the bill prior to adjournment. These messages are more necessary now than ever and when the bill comes up for a vote supporters must be ready to hold their seats on the floor to block any possible trickery by foes of the bill.
