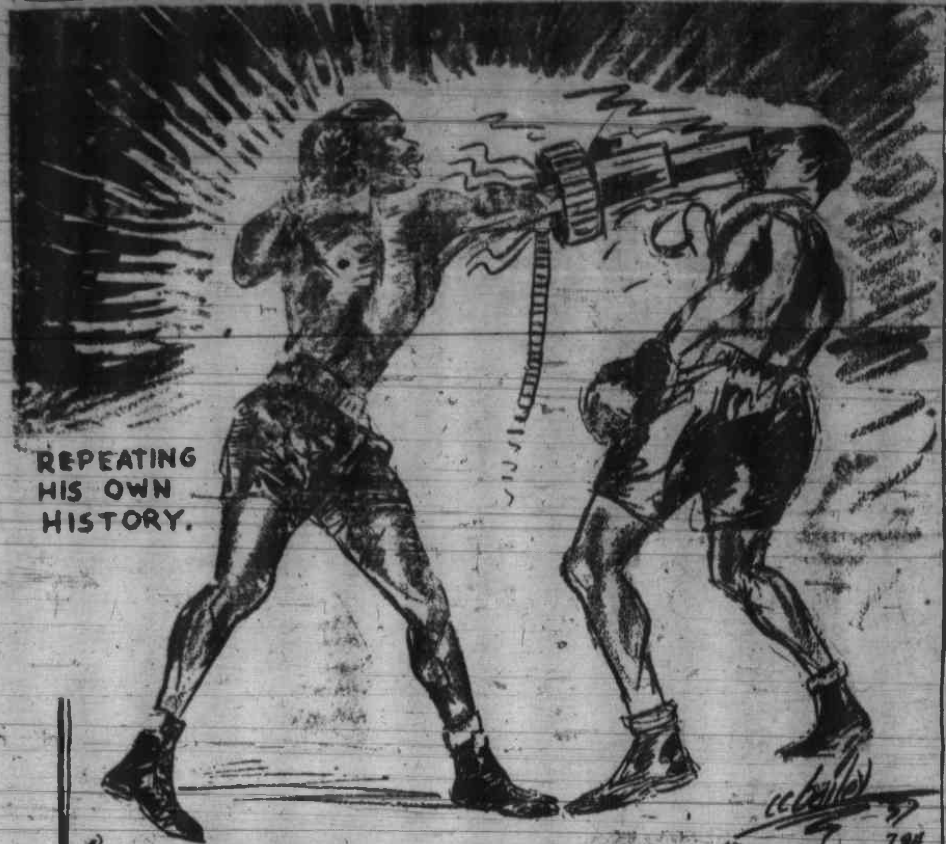

TWO DIVINE PERIODICALS DISCONTINUE PUBLICATION

NEW YORK—(PFS)—The troubles which are currently shadowing the kingdom and prospects of the little brown skinned cult leader, Father Divine, continued to mount and harass him last week as two publications which had contributed to his support and to the spreading and growth of his kingdom, suspended publication. The two publications, The Spoken Word and The World Herald, the former a magazine and the latter a tabloid-sized newspaper, transferred their assets to Hy Emanuel, of 334 Eastern Parkway, Brooklyn. Assignment was filed by Daniel Lore, business manager and owner of the publications, both of which have their principal offices at 36 West 115 street, only a few doors from Father Divine's principal "heaven" at 20 West 115th street. According to Jay Emanuel, counsel for the assignee, The Spoken Word, it was revealed, has liabilities of \$5,000. No estimate of the debts of the World Herald was given.

After the assignment was filed, John Lamb, Father Divine's white secretary, issued a statement saying that the publishing company had no financial or no other connection with Father Divine and the movement which recognizes Divine as "God" Father Divine, he declared, has given both copies of his speeches and other news but otherwise had no interest in them.

Both publications were designed to appeal strongly to Divine's followers. The dates used in each

were designated "A D F D," which means "Anno Domini Father Divine." Both referred to the cult-leader as if recognizing his claimed divinity.

Recently several speeches by Father Divine, as reported in the Spoken Word, were used in a suit now pending against the Peace Missions. Each time Divine's followers have insisted that The Spoken Word was not an adjunct of the Peace Missions and have denied that Divine had any interest in it.

FOUR MORE SENATORS PRE-DICT ANTI-LYNCH VICTORY

Washington, Aug. 27.—In statements issued here just prior to the adjournment of Congress, four more senators—Arthur Capper, Kansas; Robert J. Bulkley, O.; Bennett Champ Clark, Missouri; and Frederick Van Nuys, Indiana—express confidence that the Wagner—Van Nuys-Gavagan anti-lynching bill will be passed at the next session of Congress, now that it is a special order of business on

the Senate calendar.

Senator Clark said: "It is my belief that agreement made yesterday for making anti-lynching bill special order for very beginning of next session was best possible solution of problem for earliest consideration. At this session we would have been confronted by pressure of Administration measure and desire for adjournment which would have prevented us from presenting our full strength on any occasion. Under agreement made we have passed the obstacle of opposition to consideration which has held up the bill so long. In my judgment the action taken means certain passage of the bill very early in the next session."

Senator Capper: "I feel that those of us who favor this legislation should take encouragement

from the fact that we now have definite assurance that it will be taken up and disposed of by the Senate early in the next session. Certainly I hope for its passage at that time and I shall do everything in my power to bring about favorable action on it."

Senator Van Nuys: "The action taken by the Senate on the Wagner—Van Nuys anti-lynching bill was approved by me in my opinion it insures a vote and a favorable vote at the beginning of our next session. All supporters of the measure joined in the procedure."
