COMPLEXION CARE

A clear, fine textured skin is a fundamental necessity for every woman seeking to make the most of her natural beauty. This important factor cannot be neglected if you hope to obtain the well-groomed appearance which is so vital to women everywhere today.

Open pores make up to cover skin blemishes which can and should be corrected now. Medical attention should be sought for extreme cases of pimples or acne. These may be caused by many different ailments of the bodily functions and should be handled very carefully because of their infectious nature when opened. Your doctor will advise in addition to his constitutional treatment, absolute cleanliness of the skin and constant elimination of the excretion is the pimples. A reliable antiseptic such as alcohol should be used after each pimple has been opened and contents discharged and then the entire face sponged with an antiseptic wash—a boric acid solution will be found useful.

Tips to the Teen-Age
If you are in your teens and have a normal skin, soap and water are the beauty aids for you in addition to a lubricating cream which should be used occasionally. Don't feel that you must have a host of expensive preparations on your dressing table—a good cream and a mild soap will do nicely. Lather the face and neck generously and rub with a complexion brush until the lather is creamy and the skin is cleansed and stimulated. Then rinse thoroughly in clear, moderately warm water and finish off with a dozen cold rinses. Rinsing clears the skin of soap as well as acting as a mild astringent. Then follow with a light application of lubricating cream. This is a simple inexpensive beauty method and is very effective when used regularly.

Some young girls are bothered with pimples and blackheads. This condition is usually the result of a disturbance of the oil glands of the skin. Excessively dry skin makes the skin oily, which collects the dust and grime from the air. The resultant mixture of dirt and oil clogs the pores, making it difficult for the skin to rid itself of its natural secretions. These gradually expand the pores, forming a wax-like substance which is topped by a blackhead.

Treatment for Oily Skin

The treatment outlined above may be used with some variations for the correction of oily skin and blackheads. The water used should be as hot as is comfortable. The soap should contain more alkali and the rinses following should be several hot rinses then gradually colder, followed by a good astringent. The use of a lubricating cream is not recommended, although many of the so-called bleaching creams may be used with effectiveness.

Women with sensitive skins suffer constantly from the use of soap and hard water, which makes their faces dry, rough and blotched for hours. Rain water is a boon to those sufferers. The alkali in the soap irritates many skins and a cleansing cream may be used with good result in such cases as a substitute for the soap and water cleansing. Olive oil or mineral oil will remove surface dirt and make-up and leave the skin smooth and clear.

A shiny nose is a handicap in business and social life. Constant application of powder may give temporary relief but it may also aggravate the condition. This condition may be removed by frequent use of a regular diet which includes raw fresh fruits, green vegetables and salads and avoids fried and rich foods which are so rich in fat and tannin.
