Coach Burghardt, who saw the recent game between Bluefield and Virginia State, returned from that encounter a very much depressed young man. While Virginia came off with the victory, the score was by no means an indication of the strength of the Big Blue. The Eagles, though handicapped by the late return of several of last year's best men, have been gradually building a well-knit, speedy machine, and may be counted on to play their usual spirited game. Encouraging too is the enthusiasm with which local enthusiasts are looking forward to this first major tilt of the season for the Eagles. The game, which is called for Friday October 8 2:30, has been moved up one day in order to avoid conflict with the Duke Homecoming game of October 9, to be played with the University of Tennessee.

### Bears Surprise Va. Squad With Fast Attack

Starting its 1937 football season, the St. Paul Varsity Tigers dropped the first game to Shaw University of Raleigh, N. C. by a score of 33-0. Although they lost, the whole team played well throughout the entire game.

The first quarter was played mostly in St. Paul territory. During this time Shaw was gaining on practically every run. Gauvan, Shaw's sensational full back, made the first touchdown of the game. In the second quarter Bates, St. Paul's star fullback, made two excellent runs but the Bears recovered the ball when kicked by Boyd of St. Paul. Gauvan carried the ball on the 40 yard line and ran 60 yards for a touchdown. The extra point was made by Moore with a line plunge. The half ended with the score 13-0 in Shaw's favor. Vines

kicked off for the beginning of the third quarter. Shaw received the ball and made four successive first downs putting the ball on the 2 yard line, where excellent blocking and tackling by St. Paul held them there for four downs. It was then that Pinn made two touchdowns and Bunch and Gauvan made an extra point each with forward passes.

The fourth quarter saw St. Paul doing a great deal of forward passing, two of which were completed. These did not gain much and Shaw again obtained the ball and Fleming made the last touchdown of the game making the final score 33-0.

Much credit must be given to Gauvan, who played well for the Shaw Bears at full-back position, also Creecy at half. Outstanding for St. Paul were Bates at Full-back position, Wright at guard and Clarke at quarter-back.
