New Swimming Pools Attract Thousands

CHICAGO, Oct. 6 (AP)—With the advent of the nippy, zesty weather of early autumn, and the consequent closing of the city's beaches, swimming pools, and other recreation spots, Chicago's colored citizenry this week voiced widespread approval of the unsurpassed bathing facilities offered them at the beautiful 31st street beach and the two new swimming pools opened last July in both Madden and Washington Parks on Chicago's Southside.

Mayor Edward Kelly, officials of the Works Progress Administration, V. K. Brown, chief of recreation, Chicago Park District, George T. Doneghue, general superintendent, Park District, and members of the Park Board have all won the commendation of a grateful citizenry for making these facilities available to the general public.

Madden Park, with K. A. Bristol as the director, is located in the area bounded by 37th and 39th streets, and Vernon to Rhodes avenues, has a large screened-in pool, 150 by 50 feet, with look-out stations atop ladders for Life Guards Charles Dorsey, Irving Payton, and assistants Locker room and shower facilities for men and women are provided and water for the big pool is automatically treated and chlorinated in a specially built plant at the south end of the pool. This provides a constant flow of fresh water to guard the health of swimmers.

At Washington Park, with J. Turner as director, the Triple Pool proved a stellar attraction, with swimmers of both races

All three sections of Washington Park's pool adjoin each other in uniform design. The largest section is 230 by 60 feet; the second, 164 by 60 feet, standard Olympic measurements and laid out in meters for competitive swimming; the third unit, a 11-foot diving pool, 60 by 40, and the center of attraction for the many thousands of visitors as beginners and novices are barred because of the accident hazard. There are three spring-boards at various heights, for the skilled divers and long rows of commodious seats for the spectators. Only those in bathing suits are permitted to enter the section housing the Triple Pool, a high wire screen separating it from the spectator's gallery.

Life guards assigned at Washington Park this past summer were J. Draper, Robert Gamble, Charles Murray, Oliver Senior, and several assistants. Those at 31st street beach were Lawrence Alexander, Howard Cooley, Lawrence Harding, Luray Hayes, G. Henderson, Jr., Andrew Jackson, Kenneth Lonsie, William Owens, Mirault Ward, and Wm. Whitlow.

Hampton Pirates Take Air To Win Over S. C. State

Taylor and Hudgins Star for Pirates; S. C. State Team Covered More Ground

HAMPTON Institute, Va. Oct. 8—By virtue of the extra point which followed the touchdown on a short pass into the end zone from Taylor to Hudgins, ex-Phoenix High School star end, the Blue and White clad boys of Hampton Institute defeated the powerful S. C. State Bulldogs 7-6 on Armstrong Field Saturday afternoon.

S. C. State threatened Hampton's goal several times as they made eight first downs to the Pirates four, but only once did the "big boys" from Orangeburg succeed in crossing the double stripe of the Seaside.

The second touchdown via the air route was scored by the Taylor-Hudgins combination in the third period, but was invalid because of holding in the Pirate line. The Hampton eleven threat-

ened seriously to score in the closing minutes of the first half by driving the ball across State goal but were stopped three yards short as the gun-barked the close of that period.

Coach Ollie Dawson's Bulldogs marched 37 yards to the Hampton five yard line in three plays following the kick-off, only to lose the ball on downs from which point Taylor of Hampton was forced to kick out of danger. Again the Bulldogs asserted their power as the shifty ball carriers maneuvered behind the beautiful blocking of the unusually big line. Getting the ball to the Hampton 23 yard line with Watson and Melant doing the totting, Taylor of Hampton stopped the march by intercepting a pass and running to his own 35 yard line before being downed.

It was in the second period that the Pirate line blocked beautifully to send fleet-footed "Lil' Jim" Griffin streak off thirty yards to put the Seaside on the one yard line from which point

the pass from Taylor to Hudgins was completed to give the home team its score. Montague, diminutive quarterback, kicked the extra point which later was the margin of victory.

The third period found the two teams battling on fairly even terms with S. Carolina getting the edge on first downs and ground gaining. However, thrill and chills again enveloped the spectators when in the closing chapter the Bulldogs drove down the field in four plays to score. The ball was brought into scoring position by the fourteen yard completed pass from Watson to Harvey followed by three successive off tackle plays with Melant going over to score from the three yard line. The attempt for the extra point was unavailing.

Pirates To Clash With Va. State Saturday

Hampton College champions of the last two weeks have been kept hard at work in their preparation for the game of the season with the Hampton Pirates on Armstrong Field next Saturday.

The Trojan big four coaching staff headed by Harry A. "Big Jeff" Jackson, who is ably assisted by James A. More, Tom Verdell, and Roscoe "Turkey" Lewis, looks toward the Hampton game with high aspirations offset with grave forebodings.

Having already stepped out in front in the CIAA by decisively defeating the Bluefields Big Blues 20 to 0, in the season's opener two weeks ago, and beset with the possession of a veteran team in every department, the Trojans loom as favorites in Saturday's game. But Coach Jefferson has a different start on the matter.

Questioned concerning the prospects of his team in the pirate contest, the retund and genial head-coach of the Trojans expressed fear and stated his high respect for any team coached by the crafty veteran, "Gid" Smith.

In the center will be dependable George Lamb of Norfolk.
