

Rev. Valentine Goes To A.M.E. Conference

St. Joseph A.M.E. Church, Durham, North Carolina winds up a successful conference year. The pastor, Rev. J. A. Valentine, goes to the Greensboro conference with a full report.

The historic St. Joseph Church has enjoyed both in financial and spiritual growth one of the best years of its history. Culturally and religiously it is one of the most progressive churches in the city, both as to form and matter, and adapted to meet the present day problems and needs.

praise-worthy work in the field of missions and social service. Perhaps the most outstanding missionary society in the South is in St. Joseph. Mrs. Minnie S. Pearson, State President of the W. F. and H. Missionary of the A.M.E. Church, is a competent leader in this field.

The Pastor's Bible class which

meets every Thursday night is a new creation and it grows with the weeks. Thirty-two converts and fifty new members have been added to the Church through revivals conducted by the Pastor.

The Sunday School under the leadership of J. H. Bailey, Jr., Supt. and leading Social worker

of Durham, the A. C. E. League and weekly prayer meetings have grown tremendously with Church attendance has almost doubled itself.

"Men's Day" last Sunday marked the closing event for the Conference year. Geo. W. Co-trustee and agency director of North Carolina Mutual Life In-
