

J. A. Rogers Reveals Truth About Negro

GREENSBORO, N. C. — The average history in regard to the Negro is about 85 per cent false, said J. A. Rogers, in speaking to the students and faculty of Bennett College at their chapel exercise during the week. He used as his subject "Adventures in Negro History." Miss Mary Tate, head of the department of History, in introducing Mr. Rogers, stated that he was present at the coronation of Haile Selassie in 1930.

Mr. Rogers has devoted his life to independent travel and research and has added materially to our historical record of the Negro. Perhaps his best known book is "From Superman to Man." His address included many pertinent facts.

"The first Negroes that came to Virginia in 1619 were not slaves," Mr. Rogers said and further stated that it was not until 1682 that slavery was established.

"The first person to make slavery legal was a Negro, Anthony Johnson, who brought about the first decision regarding the enslavement of Negroes who had been servant," he continued.

Three times it is recorded in the early law of this country that Negroes were prohibited from buying white people as slaves, according to Mr. Rogers, who cited the law as recorded in the New York Public Library to prove his statement. He stated that such a law was very necessary in what is now the state of Louisiana.

The fact was brought out that Negroes were the first people to inherit the new world and that the oldest monuments in the world were of Negroes. He said, "The oldest images in Europe are made of the black Christ and the black Virgin Mary and had Negroid features. These were

found in Italy, Germany, Russia and Spain, but they were destroyed during the French Revolution. When they were replaced after the revolution they were painted black but given Caucasian features. However, within the images there are still some of the original images. One of the earliest and the principal saint of Germany is a Negro, St. Morris, whose emblem, the eagle, Hitler wears on his cap today."

He further stated that the head of the Medici family, the first family of Europe from point of cultural background and from which Michael Angelo descended, was a Negro.

"The white race in Europe has no prejudices, but there is a conspiracy in this country against the real truth getting out about the Negro, regardless of this," he continued, "you will go as far as your vision points you to go." To substantiate this statement he called attention to the fact that at present there is a Negro instructor in bacteriology at Harvard University who is in charge of the Wasserman test laboratory and who recently has made very valuable discoveries.

the state, while those of the opposite race are provided that type of training, from public funds, right here in North Carolina.

In last week's issue of the Carolina Times there was published an account of a Chinese girl being accepted as a student at the University of North Carolina while native Negro American citizens and taxpayers are denied an opportunity of any kind of professional training within the state.

These and hundreds of other damnable wrongs make the meeting to be held in Raleigh on December 12 an important gathering, and it should be attended by Negroes from all over the state. The race must be awakened to these deliberate injustices committed against its development. It must become aroused to action.

Frankly the Carolina Times feels that too long we have pursued a pacifist course in these matters, and gotten no where with it. We believe the race ought to try the federal courts. It ought to try for once in North Carolina its rights to those things guaranteed it under the constitution of the United States and the state of North Carolina. Here is work a plenty for the North Carolina Committee on Negro Affairs.

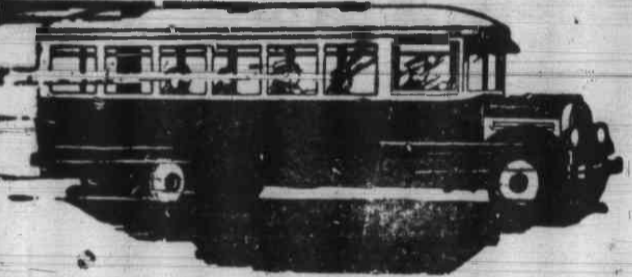

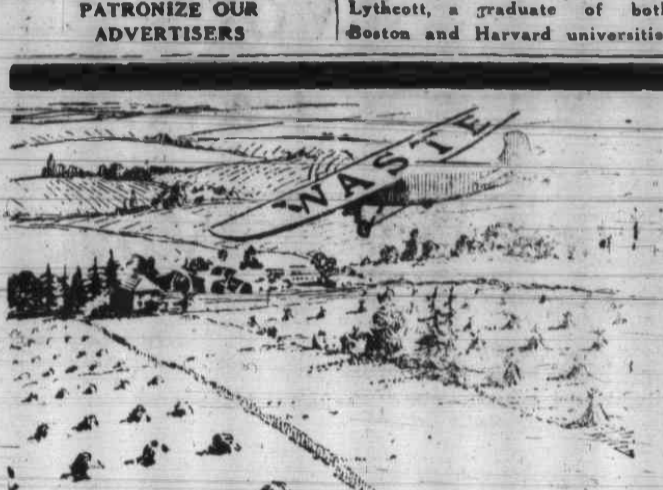

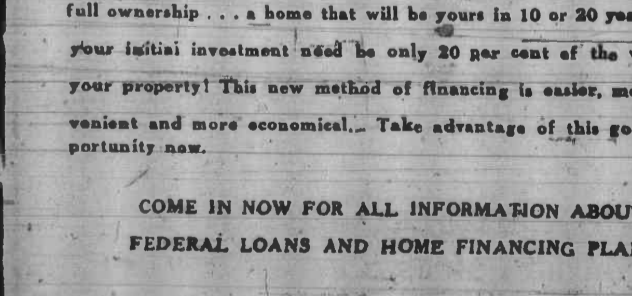
