War On Disfranchisement Should Be On Program Of Reformed Republicans

NAACP Tells Governor Aiken All Southern GOP Leaders Are Corrupt and Mere Pawns of The Party Will Not Correct Evils

NEW YORK, Dec. 15—A demand that Republican party leaders attack the problem of reorganizing the party "by launching a campaign to and disfranchisement of qualified voters wherever the franchise is now denied in the many parts of the United States" was made this week in a letter to Governor G. D. Aiken of Vermont by the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.

The association's letter, signed by Walter White, secretary, was occasioned by Governor Aiken's statement of December 6 demanding reorganization of the Republican party by having it "purged of the baneful influence of the southern committee men."

who represent no one except themselves and their allied officials."

Stating that many thoughtful Negroes and whites agreed with Governor Aiken in his move for reorganization of the GOP, the Association pointed out, however, that all southern Republicans are not venal and corrupt and that many honest and sincere Negroes in the southern states have loyally supported the Republican party because they resent "disfranchisement, lynching, injustice and insult which they have encountered in the southern wing of the Democratic party."

Secretary White's letter states: "The implications, however of your further hope of securing the cooperation of the millions of patriotic fellow citizens south of the Potomac and the Ohio leads inevitably, in the absence of denial on your part, to acquiescence in the notorious and long-continued violation of the federal constitution in the disfranchisement of millions of qualified Negro and white voters in the South. "It is obvious that there can be neither temporary nor lasting solution of the evils of which you complain until every guarantee of the 14th and 15th amendments is secured to every citizen regardless of race, color or creed, in Mississippi as well as Vermont."

WAGE DIFFERENTIALS NOT JUSTIFIED BY LIVING COSTS

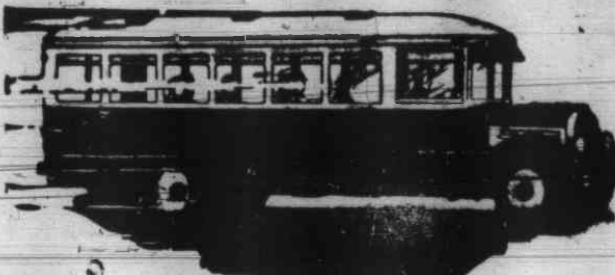
NEW YORK, Dec. 14—The argument that the cost of living in the South is so low that lower wages can be scheduled in the pending wages and hours bill is not based upon facts, according to the NAACP, which cited Department of Labor statistics to prove that it costs almost as much to live in the South as it does in the North.

In fact, the statistics cited by the NAACP indicate that in some southern cities it costs more to live than it does in Chicago.

The Association's objection to the favorite argument of those who want a wage differential inserted in the pending bill was contained in a letter to the New York Herald-Tribune on December 6.

"There is a widespread notion," the letter declares, "that a beneficial climate and other natural advantages permit southerners, both white and colored, to live an idyllic life at considerably less cost than persons living in other sections of the country. "This myth is completely exploded by a recent study by the Department of Labor. This study reveals that the cost of rent, fuel and light is lower in the South but that clothing, house furnishings and other necessities are more expensive. There is little difference in the cost of food when the prices of commodities necessary to make up a minimum standard of living are compared. When all items are averaged, the startling revelation is made that the cost of living in many southern cities is considerably greater than in many northern cities. For example, the index of the cost of goods purchased by wage-earners and lower-salaried workers, as of September 15, shows that the average for all items in Chicago is 81.3, but in Atlanta the average is 83.9; in Baltimore, 88.2; in Jacksonville, 82.4; in Norfolk, 86.9; in Savannah, 88.3; in Memphis, 89.9; in Baltimore, 88.2; in Jackson-

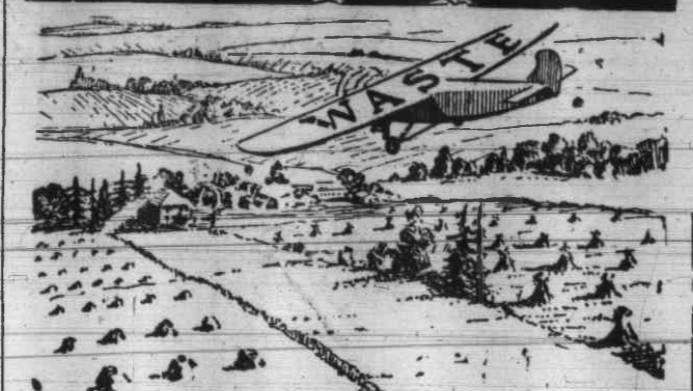
